## What is Interpersonal Violence?

*Sexual Misconduct* is a broad term including committing a Sexual Act or Contact without Consent, Sexual Exhibitionism without Consent, Sexual Exploitation and Sexual Harassment.

*Consent* means an affirmative decision by all parties to engage in mutually acceptable sexual activity. Consent means clear, knowing, and voluntary approval given by words or demonstrated actions to engage in sexual activity. This decision must be made freely and actively by all participants. Consent cannot occur where a party is prevented from resisting sexual activity because he or she is asleep, unconscious, or incapacitated due to drugs or alcohol.

*Relationship Violence* includes Dating Violence and Domestic Violence

*Stalking* means engaging in a course of conduct directed at a specific person that would cause a reasonable person to fear for his or her safety or suffer substantial emotional distress.

\*\*\*\*\*As a Graduate Teaching Assistant, you must report any incident of sexual assault, relationship violence or stalking that you learn about involving a student to the Title IX Coordinator.

All incoming students will learn more about these important topics through an on-line program called *Think About It*. Please encourage students to complete the program which will help them learn about healthy relationships, how to get help if you are a victim, how to access resources, how to intervene as a bystander, how to report, and more.
